Dalya Massachi, founder of Writing for Community Success, specializes in helping professionals in the social sector advance their missions through outstanding written materials. She is a widely published writer, trainer and consultant, and has worked in the social sector for more than 15 years.

Ms. Massachi has written countless successful grant proposals and marketing pieces, and has authored scores of newspaper, magazine, and newsletter articles (including an opinion column in *The Columbus [Ohio] Dispatch*). In addition, she has been involved with the production of several books (as co-editor, contributor or copyeditor) and has produced a number of websites and radio pieces.

Since 2001, Ms. Massachi has taught writing techniques to well over 700 workshop participants. Topics include grant proposals, marketing materials, press releases, letters to the editor, e-newsletters, websites, cover letters and resumes, grammar, proofreading, etc. She has also coached dozens of professionals one-on-one. She currently pens a regular column on OpportunityKnocks.org, entitled "The Writer's Block," and another on Idealist.org, entitled "Write Right with Dalya."

From 2000-2004, Ms. Massachi served as Founding Director of the largest network of international development organizations on the West Coast: BAIDO (Bay Area International Development Organizations).
